It can cover any historical topic of your choice, but it cannot be an event that has occurred in the last 10 years.

The mark awarded for the study accounts for 20% of the final T3 grade for all students.

It is recommended that students receive 20 hours) of class time devoted to the IA Teachers should read and give advice to students on one draft of the work. The teacher should provide oral or written advice on how the work could be improved, but should not edit the draft.
